Whereas Superintendent Patricia Trice was not transparent and displaying neutrality towards the stakeholders of VSDB as originally planned;

Whereas the consultants were handpicked by Superintendent Patricia Trice;

Whereas the blind department has to remove their mascot of "Chiefs" to a new mascot due to the fact that it is not politically correct; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, the Virginia School for the Deaf Alumni Association:

- 1. urges the Board of Visitors to reassess the Unified School plan's current timeline and compare it to the earlier timeline;
- 2. urges the Board of Visitors to ensure that neutrality and transparency is displayed throughout the whole campus which includes the teachers, staff, and students as well as the stakeholders which include the alumni and parents;
- 3. urges the Board of Visitors to instruct the VSDB Foundation to remove the current consultants and search for and appoint consultants that specialize in Deaf, Deafblind and Blind education;
- 4. urges the Board of Visitors to allow the Blind Department to choose their own mascot fully and freely as it is their rights to do so;
- 5. urges the Board of Visitors to undertake these resolutions.

We, the Virginia School for the Deaf Alumni Association, express a vote of no confidence in the leadership of our current superintendent.
