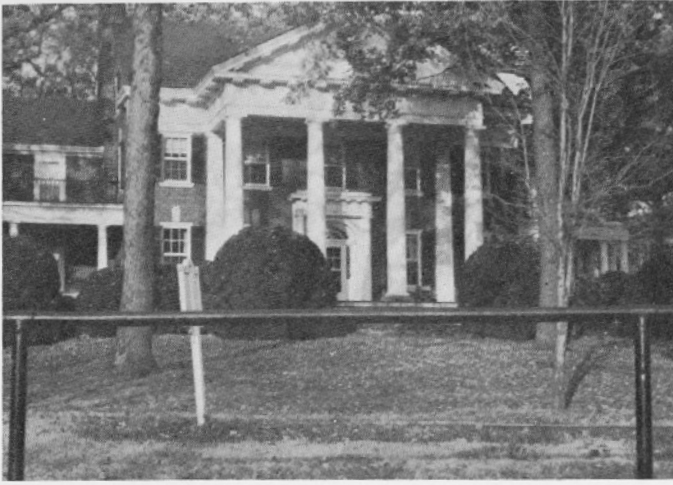
"In your blue and ancient valley,

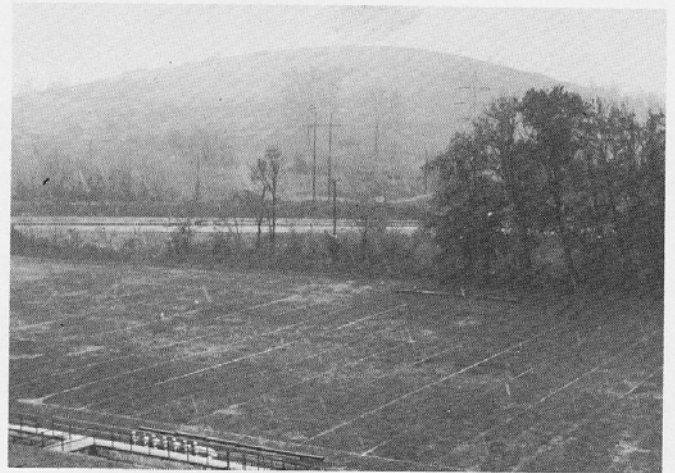

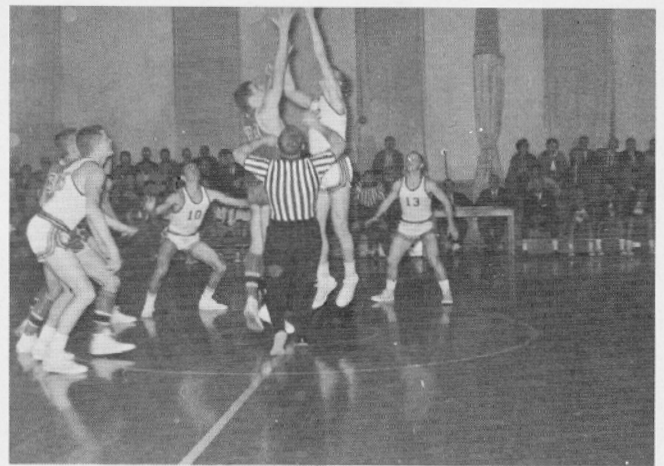

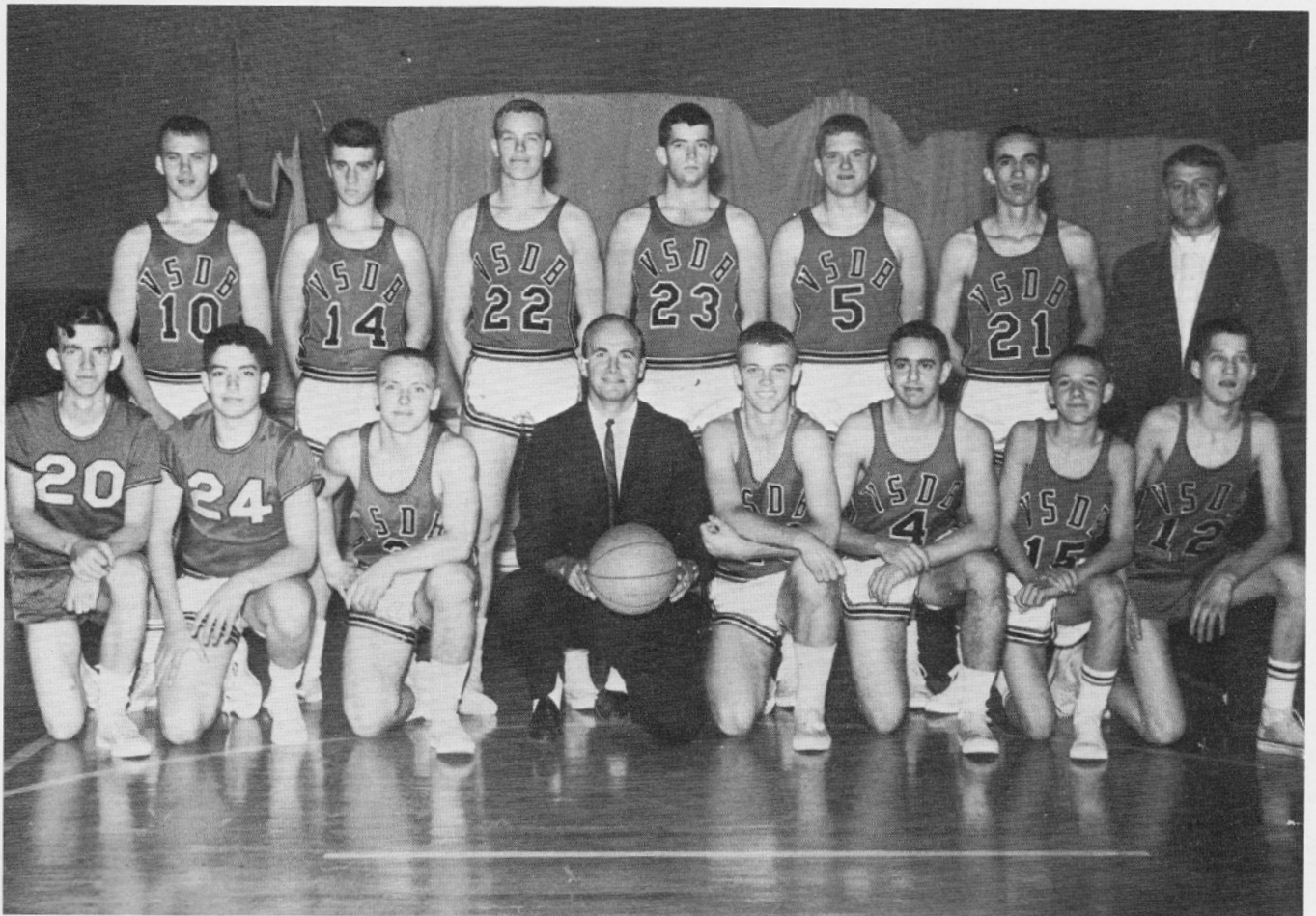

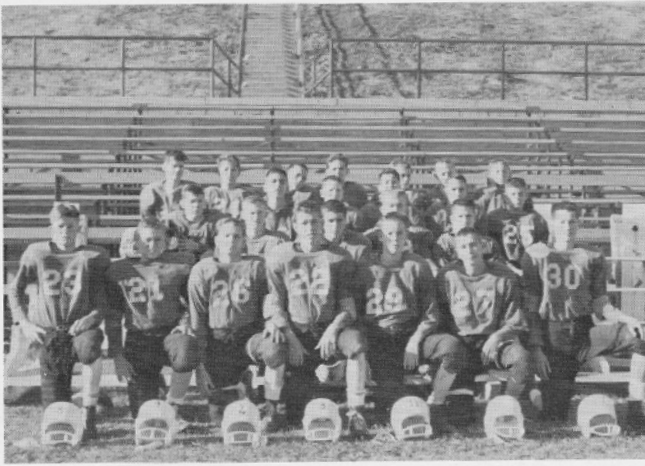

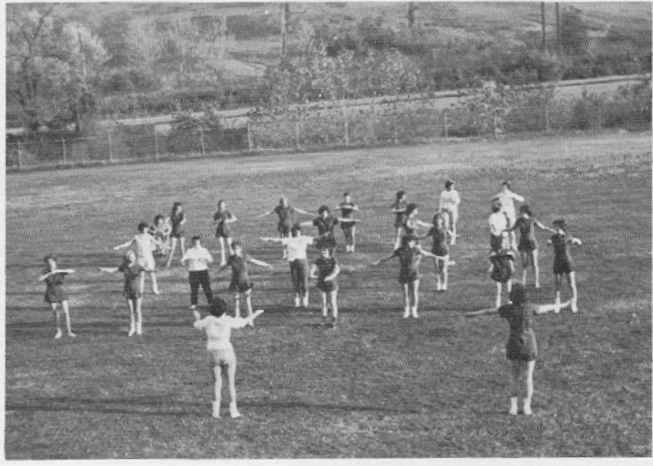

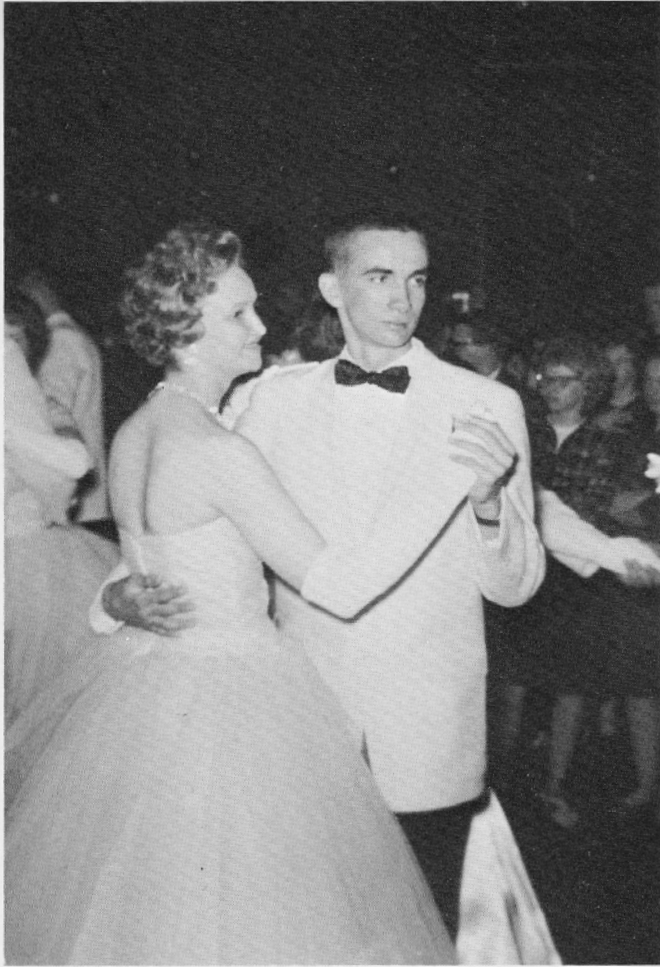

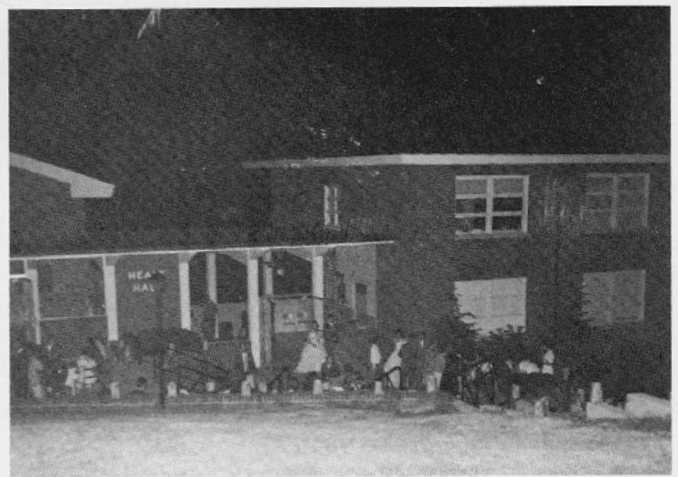
