

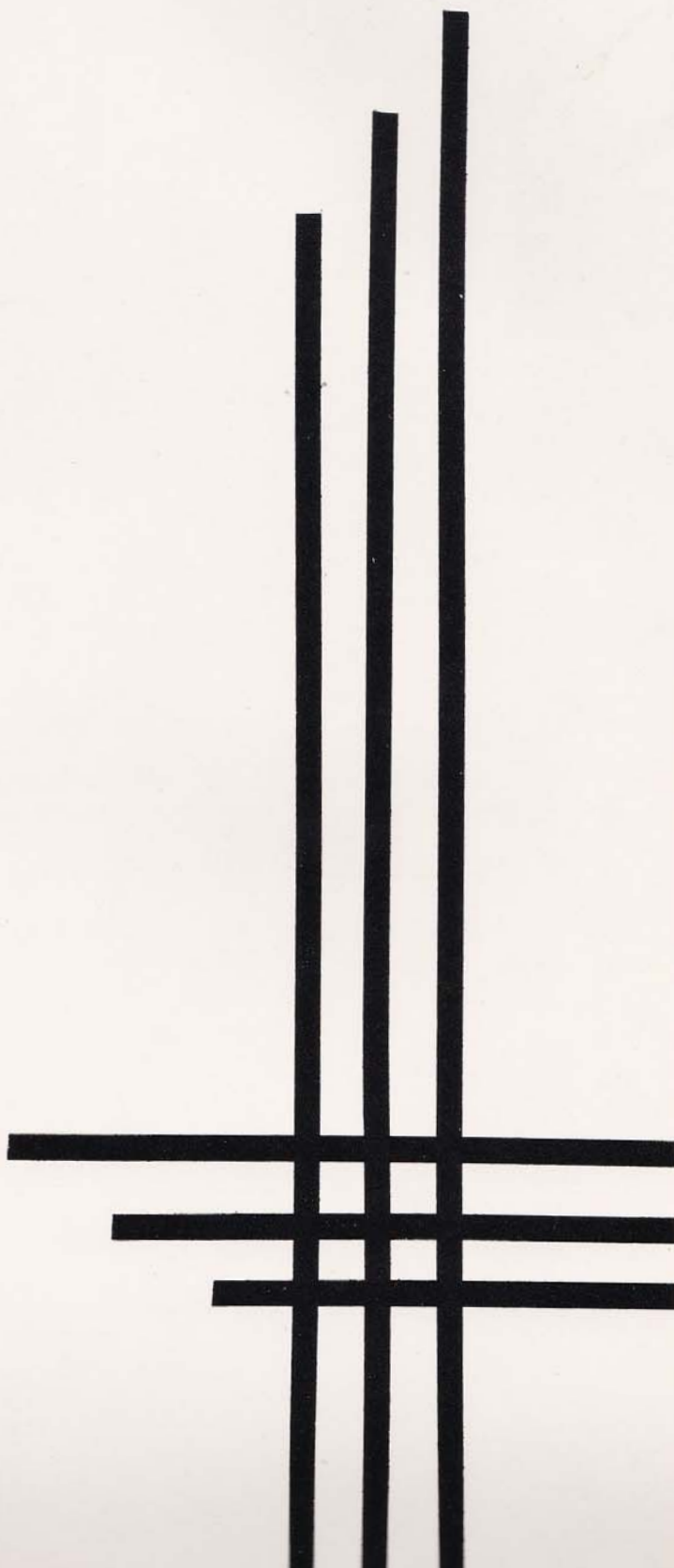

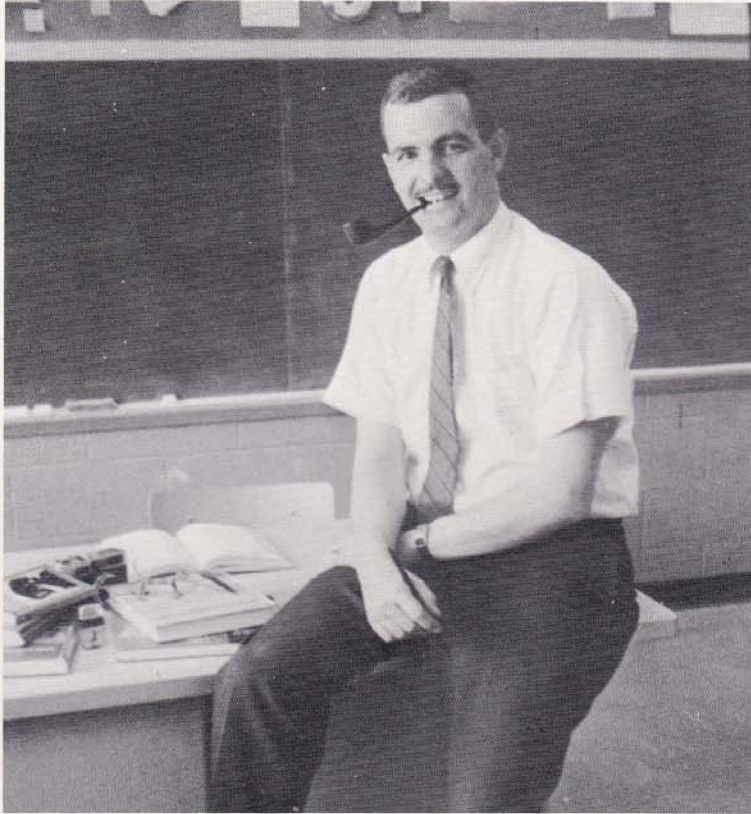

students with whom he comes in contact.

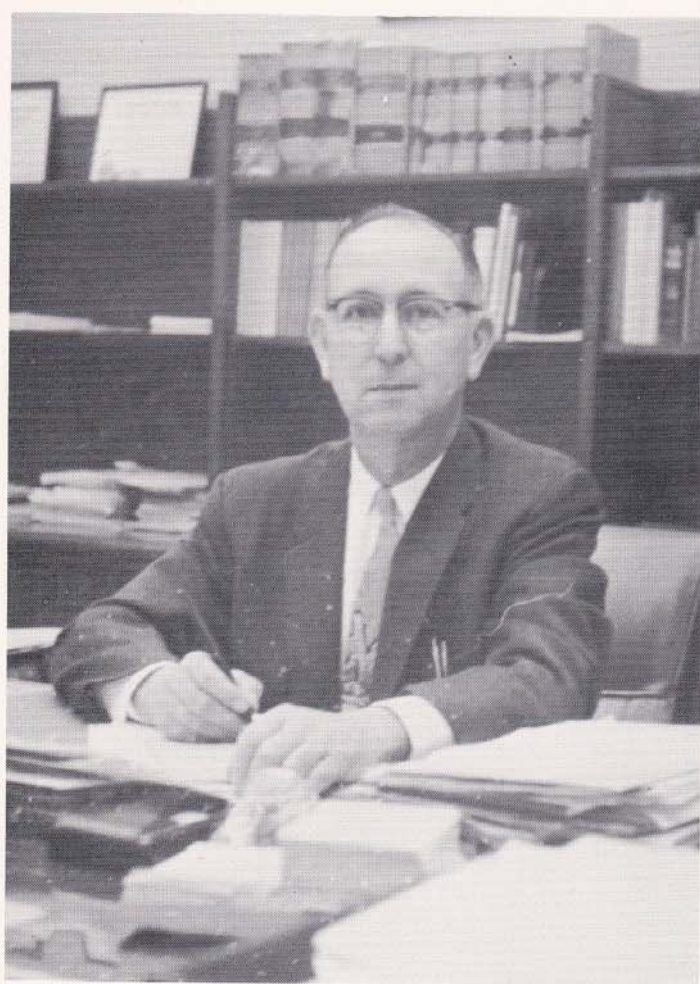
"Jan" is always ready to defend and promote the educa-

The coaches gave the football team a good workout, but it seems other coaches did the same at other schools we played which left us winless in 1963.



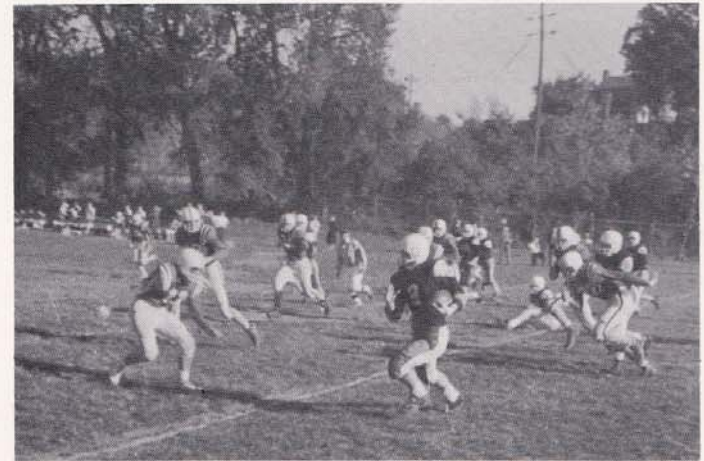

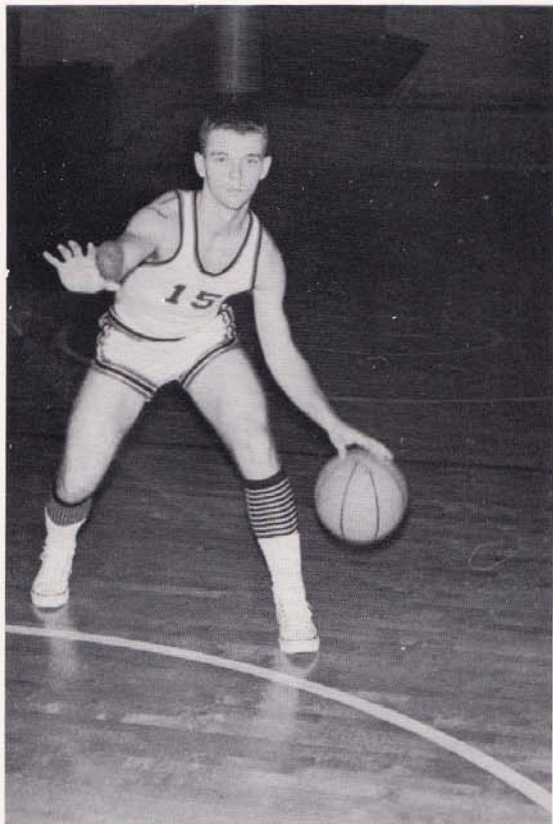

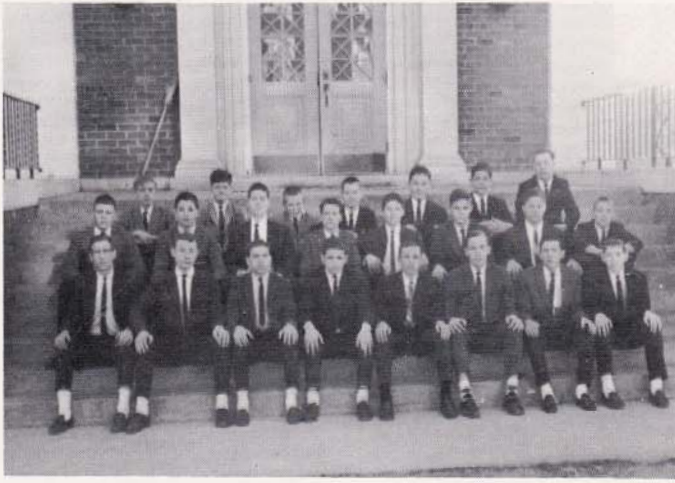
