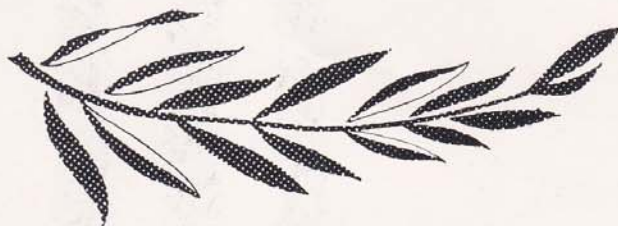


DEDICATION

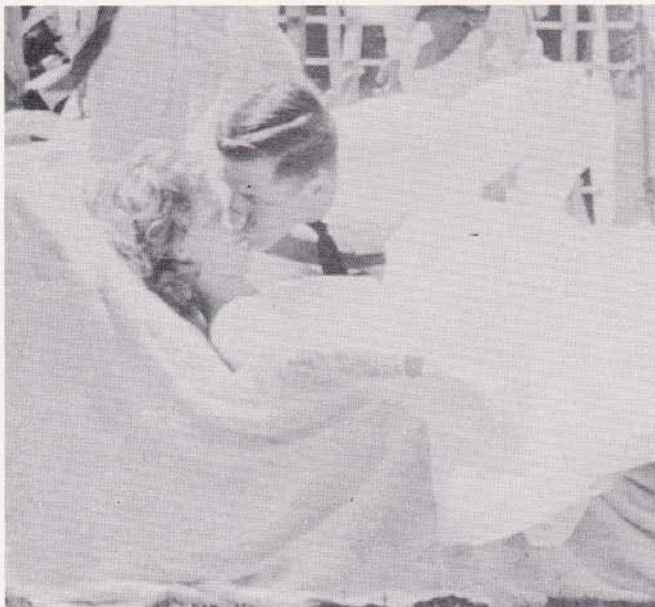
