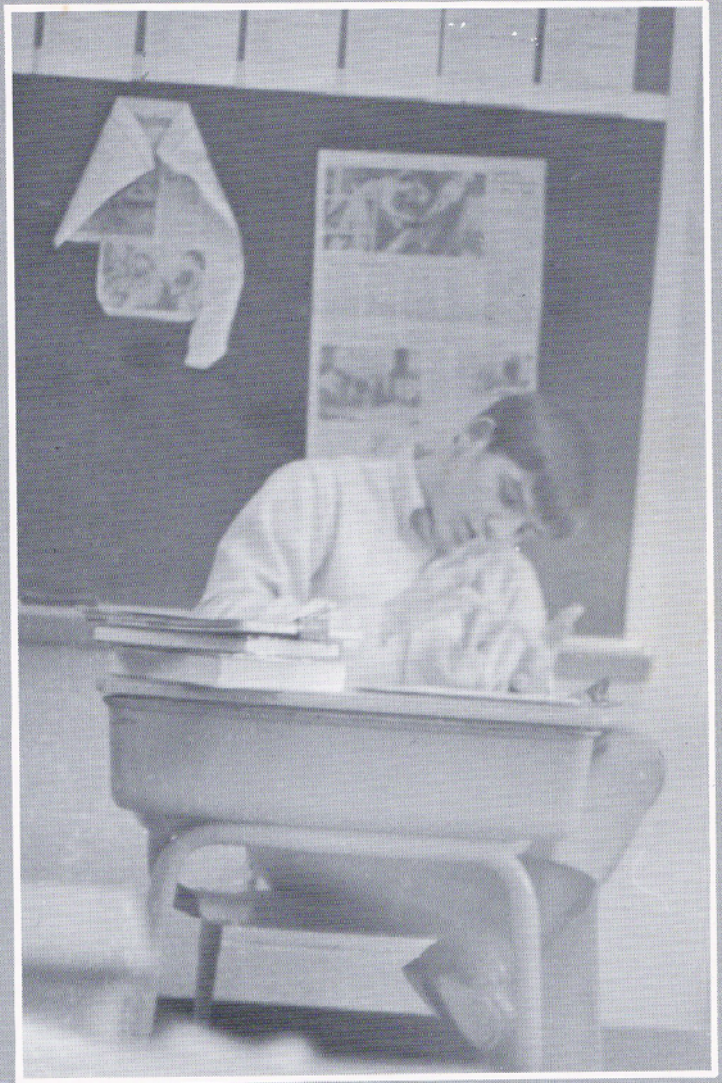


Formula

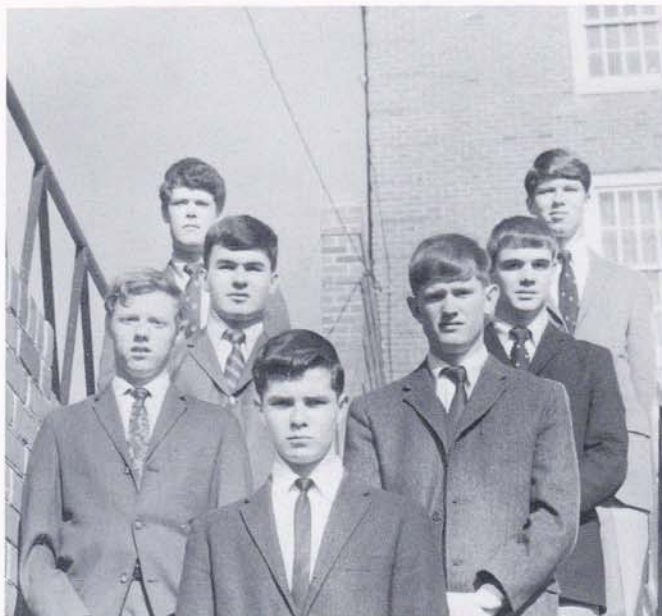
Twin Fountains

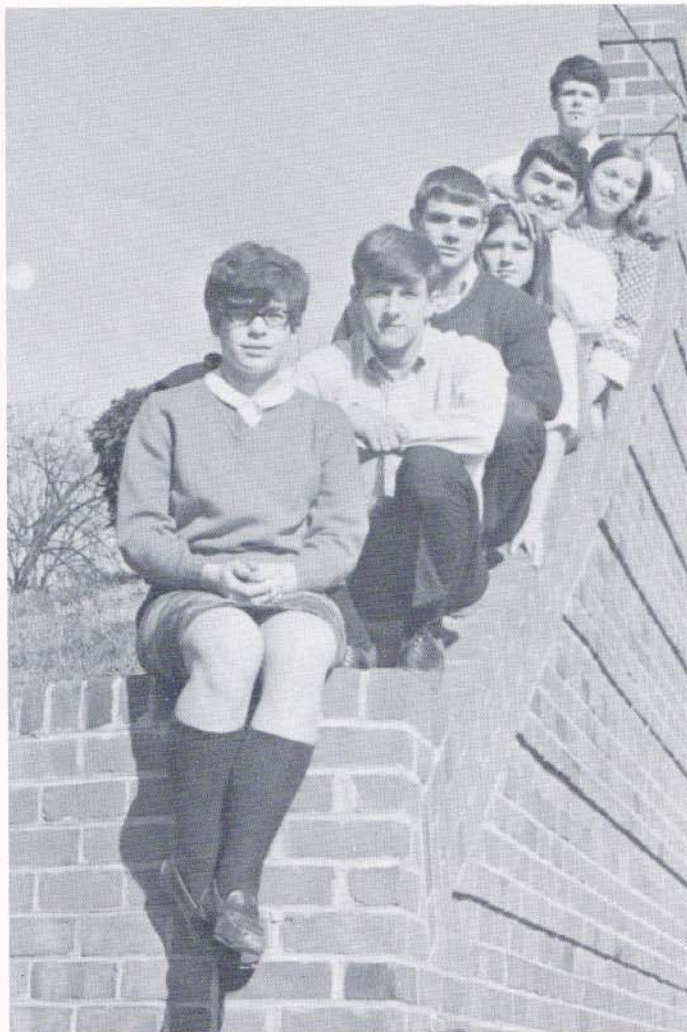
Dorm Council

Tyler Literary Society

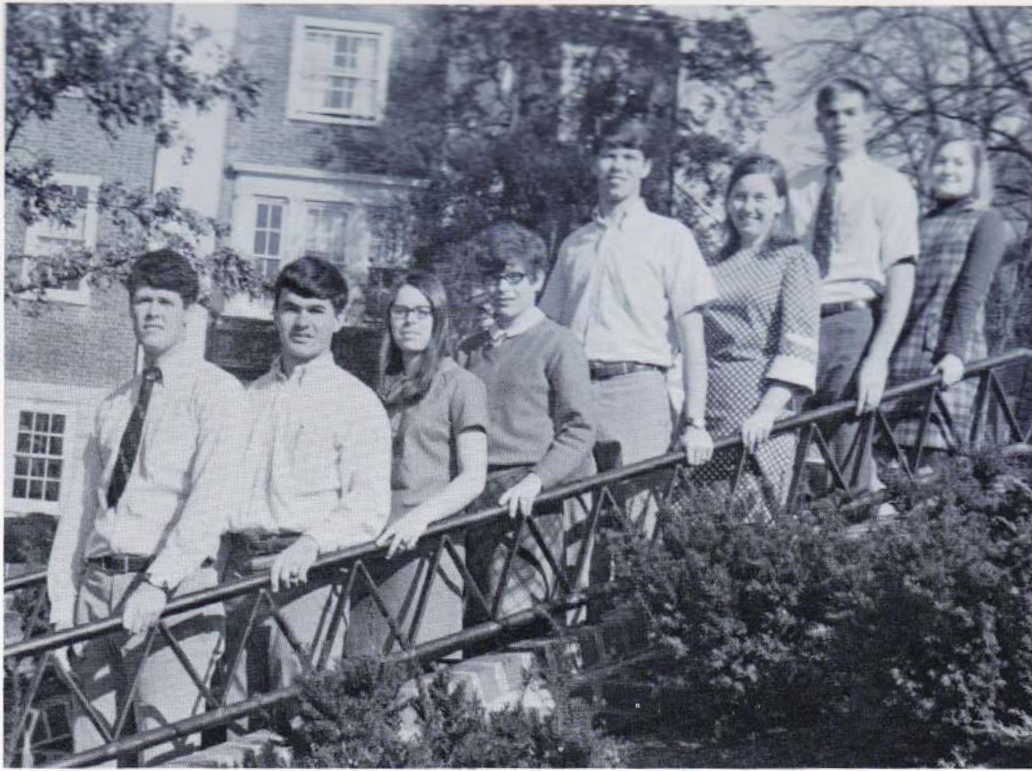

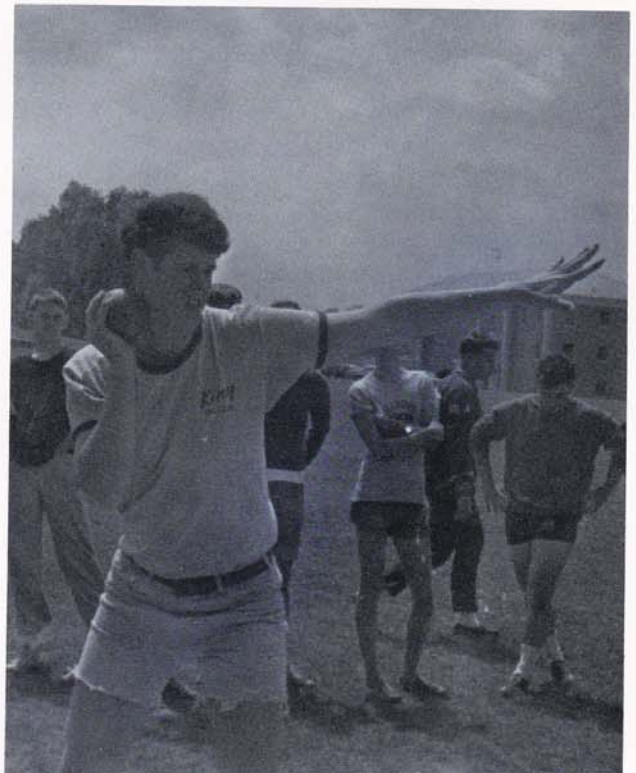
Track

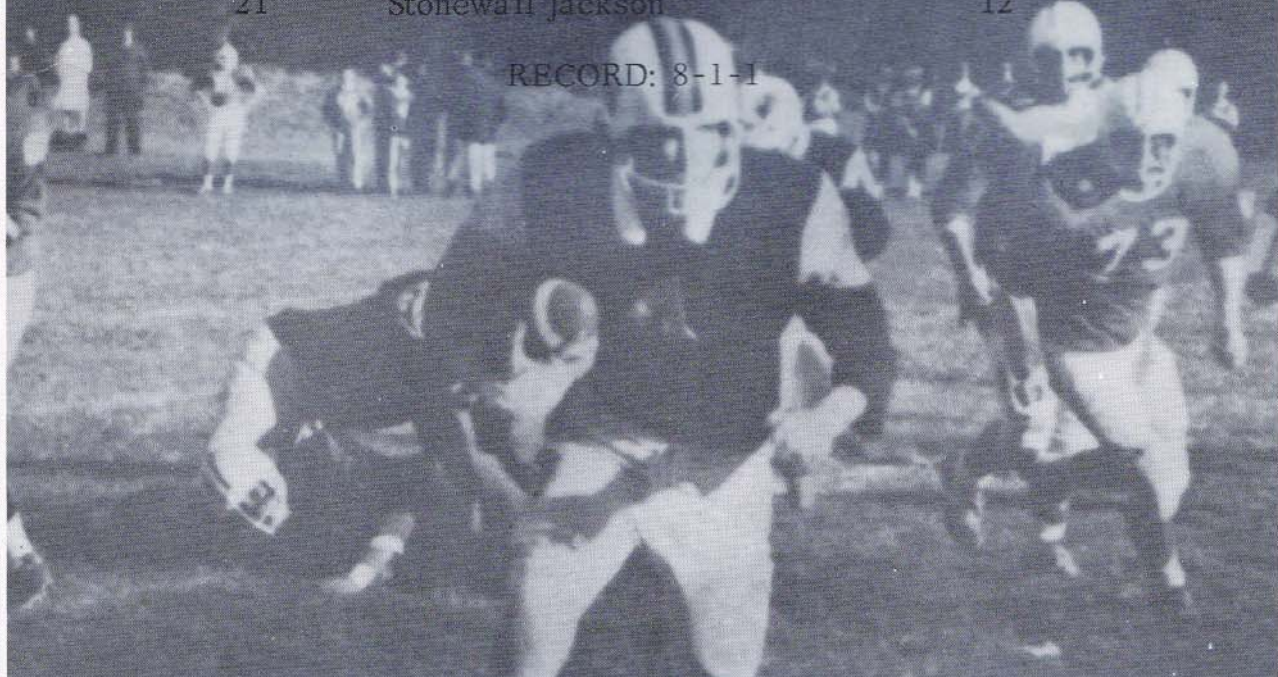

"A tremendous amount of credit is due the Cardinals, who despite their inability to hear, displayed a finesse of play execution that would be welcomed on any high school football team.

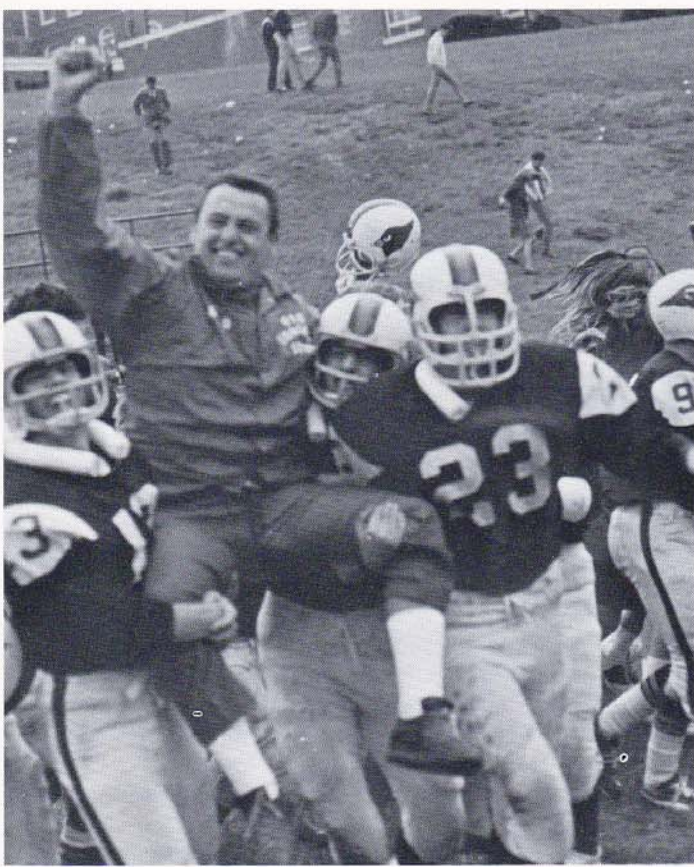
"With their firm determination, hard play, and never-quitting spirit, the Cardinals won the admiration, respect, and hearts of the football fans of Lunenburg County, and

their Charger opponents as well.

"The VSDB was added to the list of Central opponents, at the last minute, to complete a full 10-game schedule for the Chargers. But we feel sure that football fans in this area would like to see the VSDB become a permanent opponent on the Central schedule.

"If the game played last Friday night would be any indication of the games to come, there would be many hard football games, between the two schools, that would be enjoyed by all."

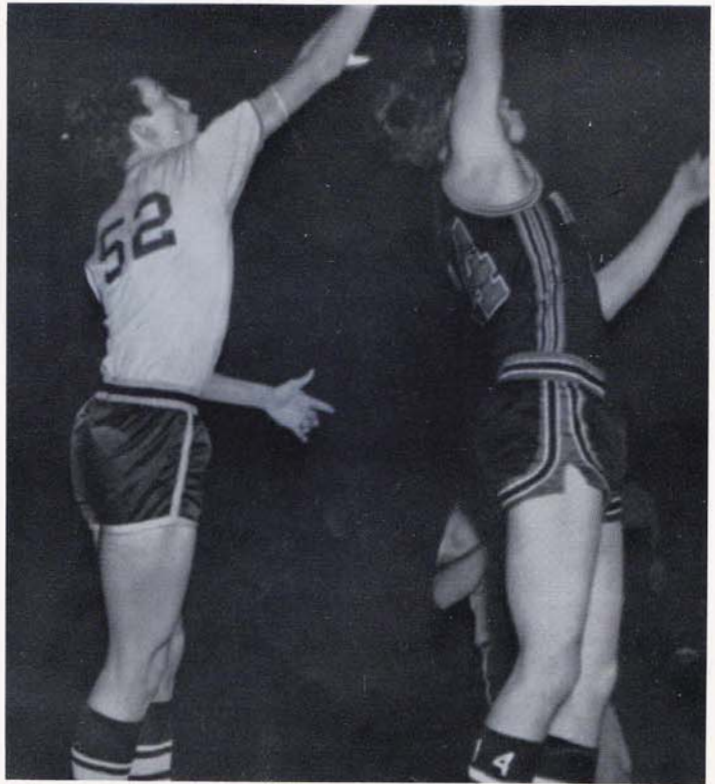

Baseball - 1968

In 1883 Instructor John Walter Michaels organized a baseball club here at VSD. The GOODSON GAZETTE of November 3, 1883, predecessor of the VIRGINIA GUIDE, said the outfit was to be known as the "Silent Baseball Club".

There is no history record of our

first baseball game since the games were played irregularly until after football was organized in 1900.

The '68 baseball team under the direction of Rocco DeVito was greatly improved by the fine work of such players as Randall Lawson, Sterling Noel, and Johnny Olinger.

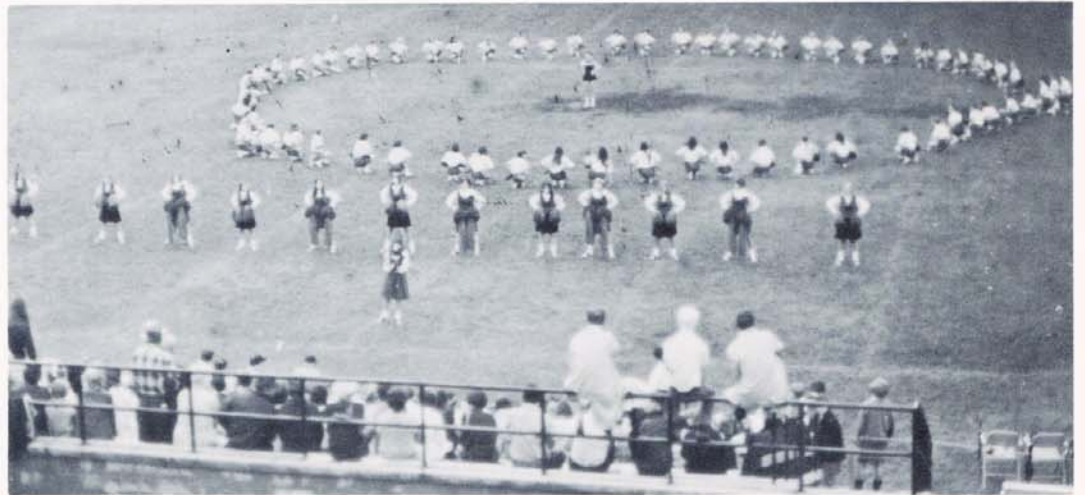
