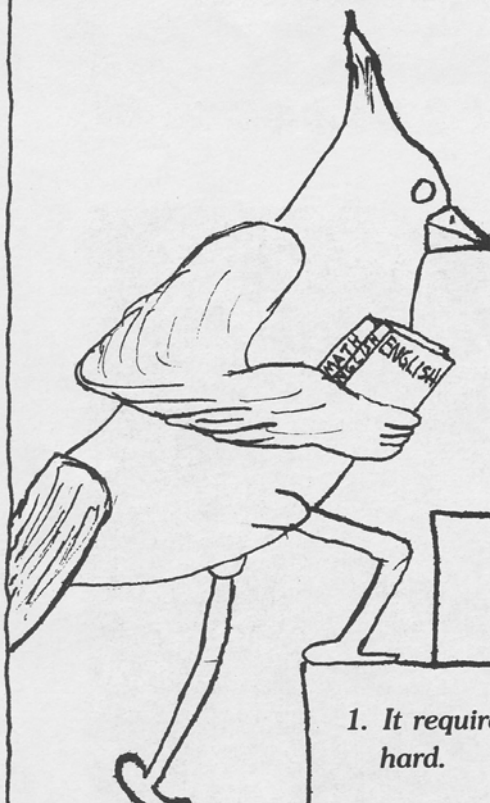

Dedication

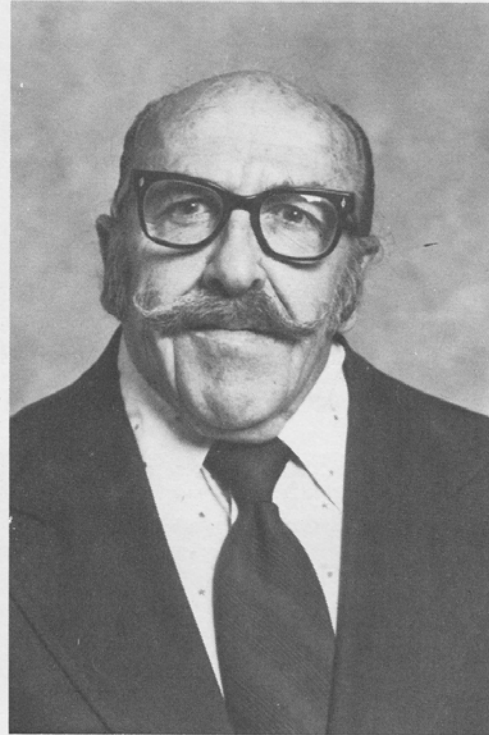
Mr. Thomas R. Sebrell

We show our appreciation to him for his many years of dedication to our school by dedicating the 1980 White Columns to Mr. Tom Sebrell.



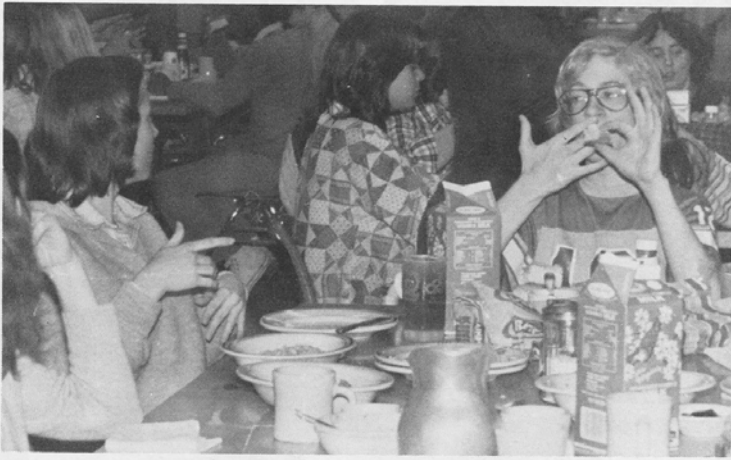

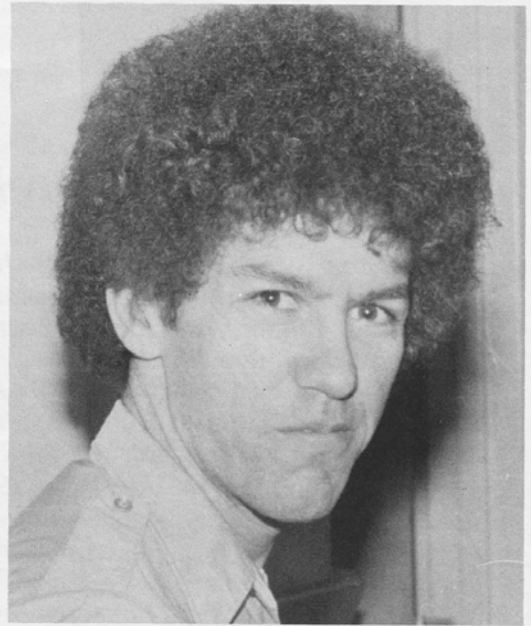

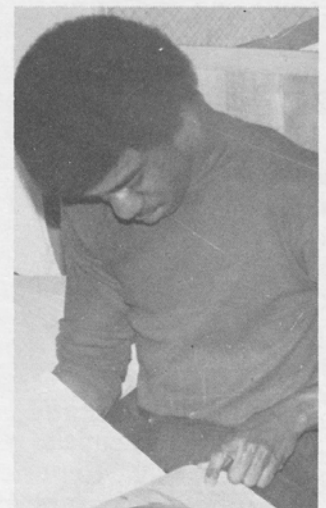

The Mime Show

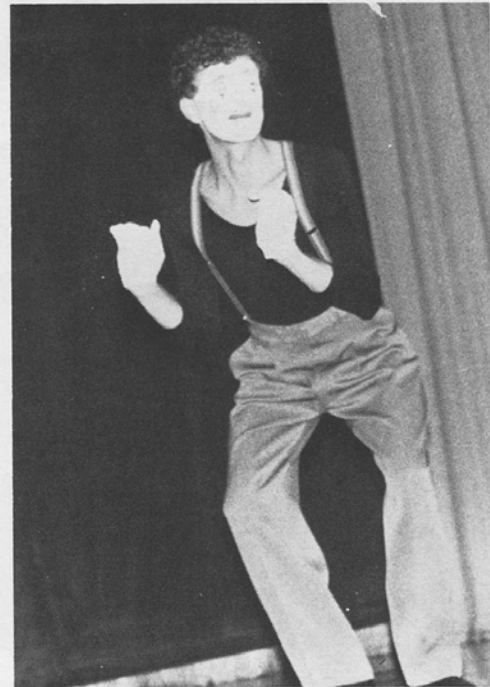

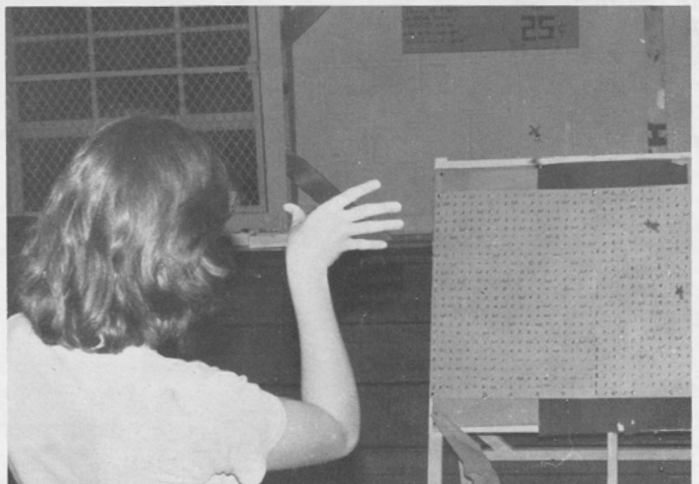

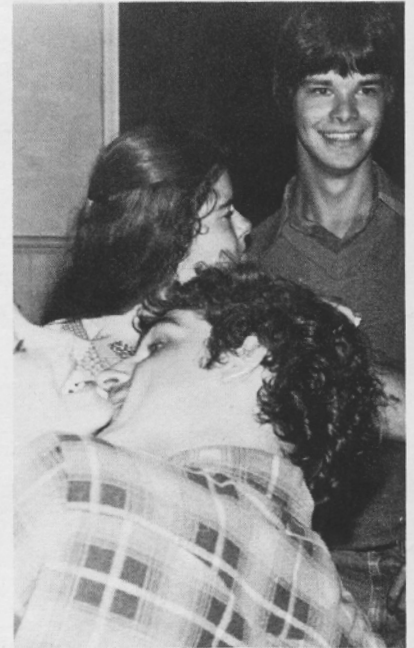

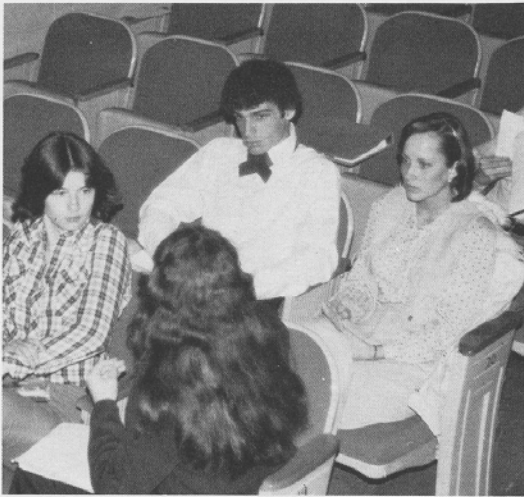

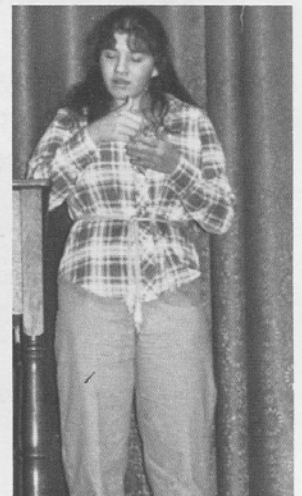

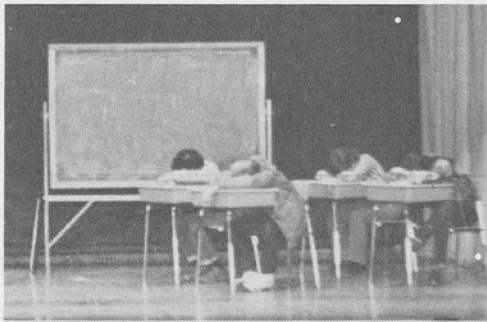

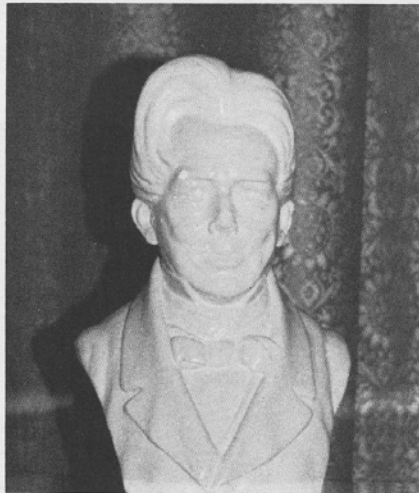

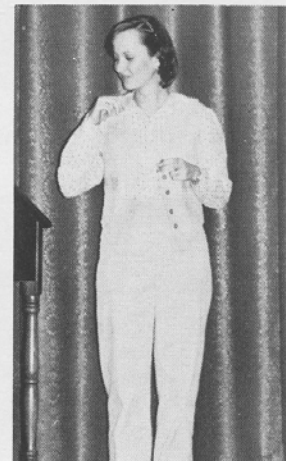

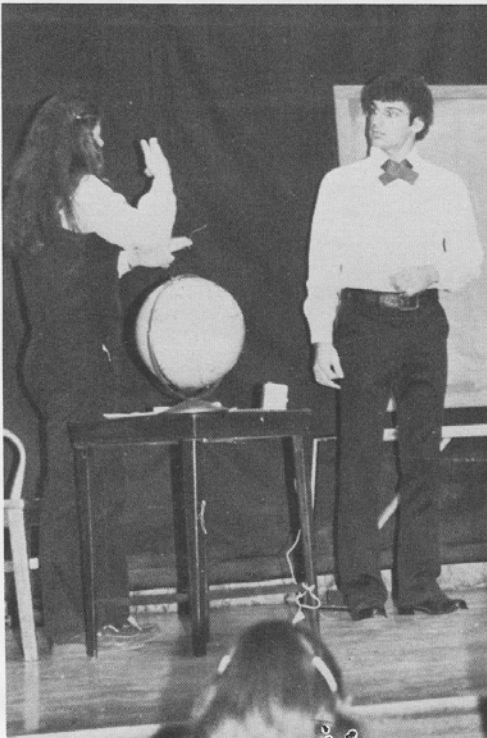

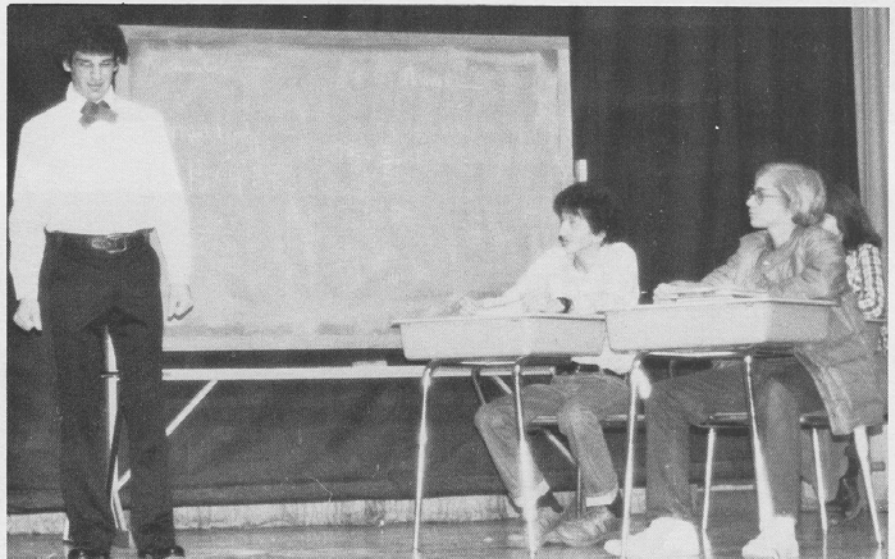

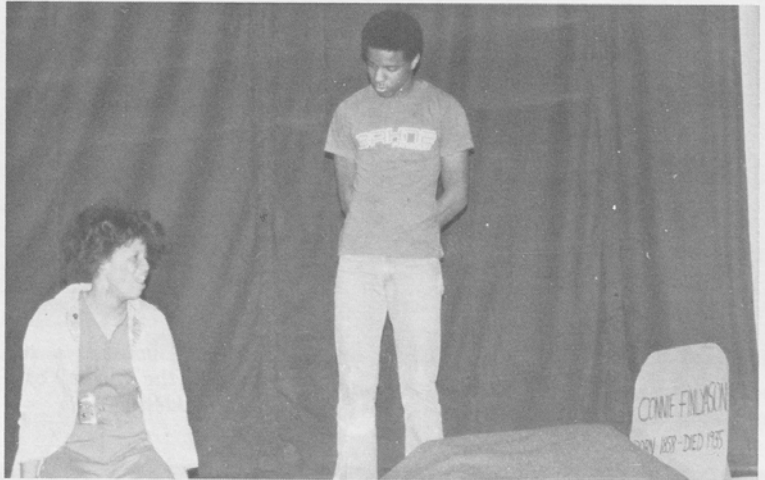

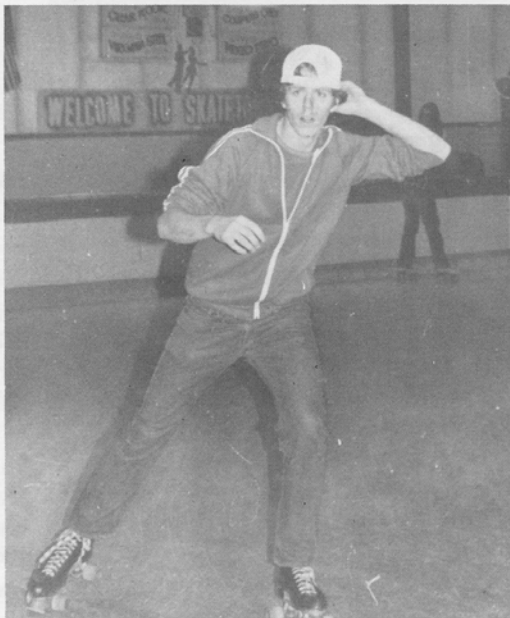

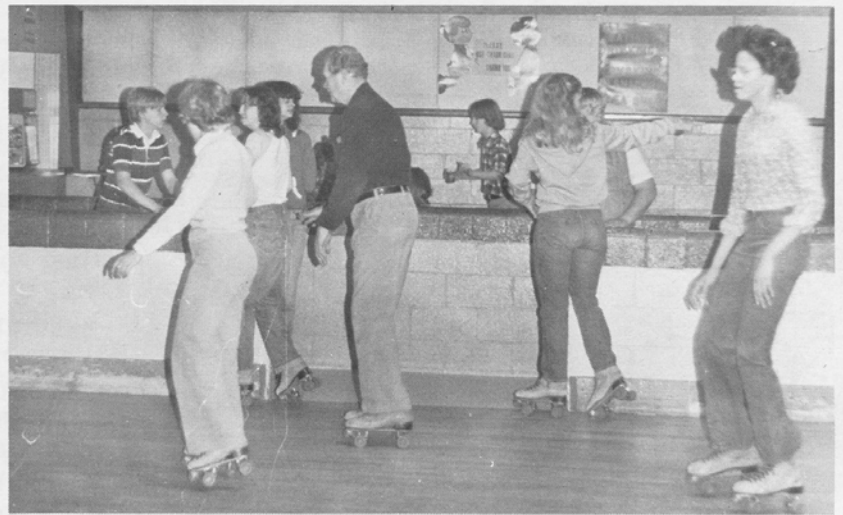

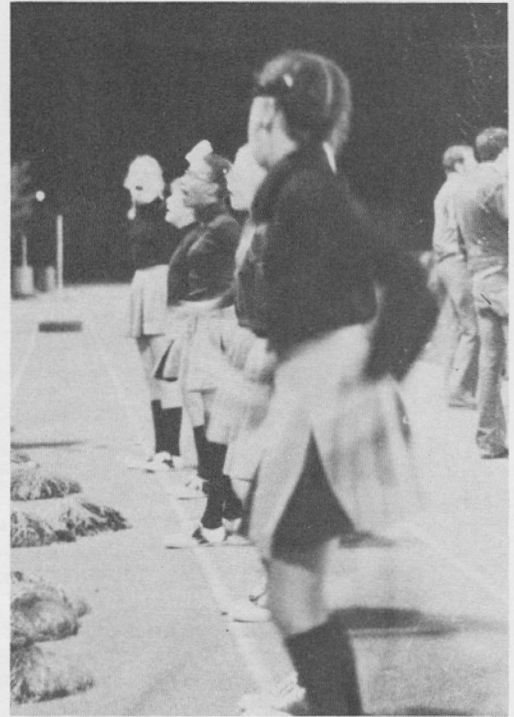

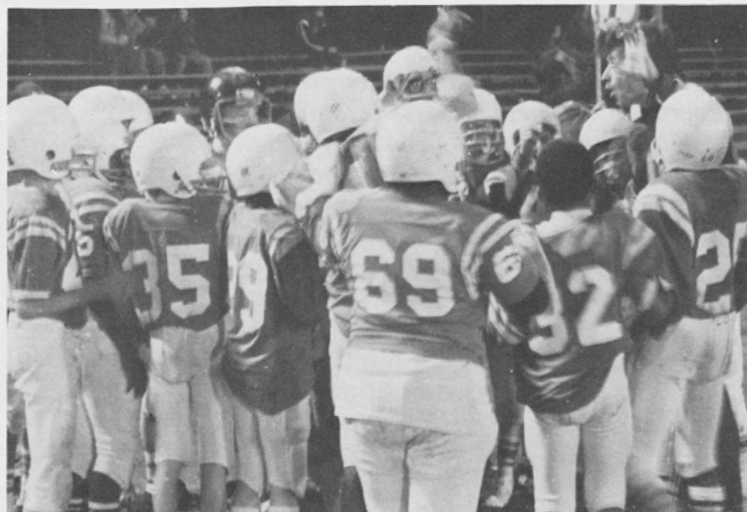

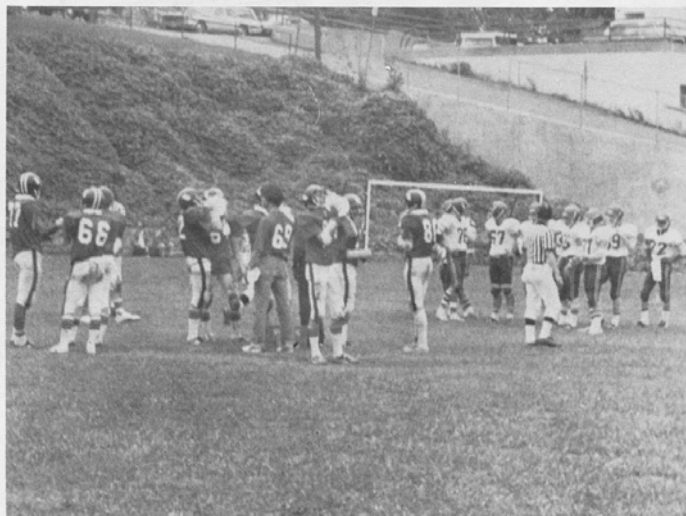

The experience really enlightened our team which made us feel worthy of playing. Now we are looking forward for the next tournament in Georgia this year.

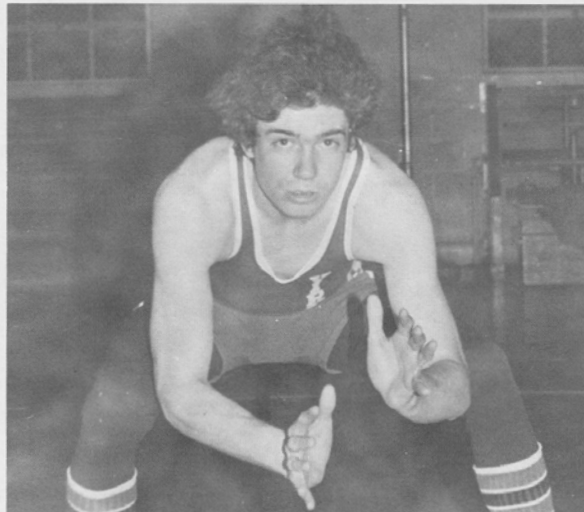
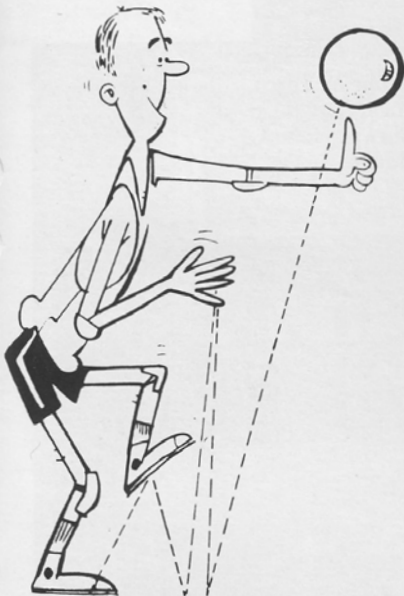
