"What Teaching Is All About"

Teaching is the most confusing profession of them all. It is constantly changing, often bewildering, and the teacher can never be sure what will happen from one day to the next.

Real teaching—not babysitting, not stuffing the students with useless knowledge—is hard, very hard. Real teaching is giving the students skills that will be useful for them for the rest of their lives; skills that they can use as a foundation for more skills and to augment still more skills. Let me illustrate this. I teach English, and English is an essential skill for survival in America especially, and in many other countries. If a student is going to lead a fruitful life after graduation, if he is going to handle job opportunities, and opportunities for a college education, he's going to need English. If he is going to live as 100% committed, first-class citizen, he needs English. But that is not all, however, the student needs many more skills for survival and this is where teaching comes in.

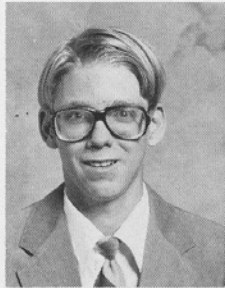
Now, I said teaching is confusing. This is because the teacher must play different roles with different people every single day. The teacher has hundreds of different responsibilities.

To fulfill all these responsibilities the real teacher must know who his students are and also who he is himself because it is easy to lose one's own personal identity and sense of worth when being constantly bombarded by the personalities of those around one. A real teacher must know subject area thoroughly and keep abreast of new developments in his field, for without possessing the skill he is to teach others, no teacher is real.

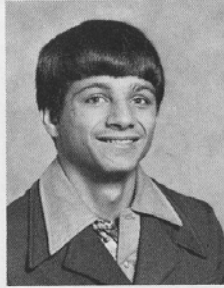
It is obvious, therefore, that real teaching is hard. I do not recommend teaching to anyone who is thin-skinned and sensitive, who is not at ease with his own subject area, and can not cope with the stress of confronting a thousand different emotional experiences day after day.

The Little League Football Team of V.S.D.B.

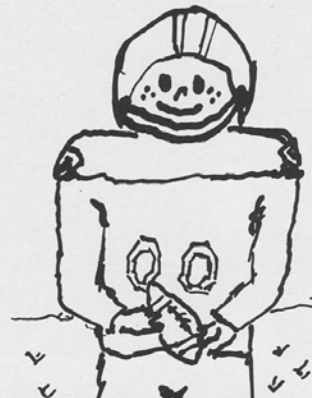

Willie Cooley came in fourth in the long jump and the Cardinals' 880 relay team placed third.

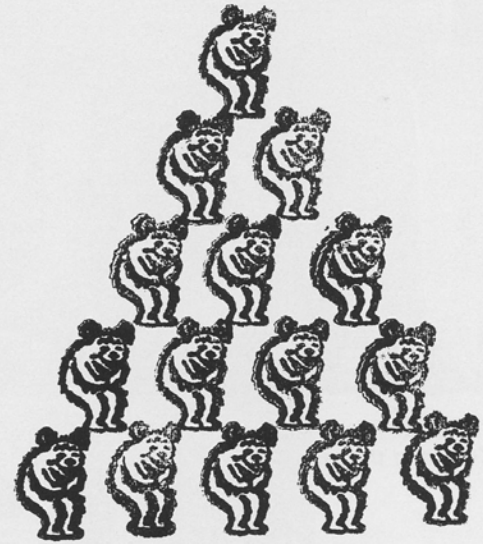
All these individual wins made the Cardinals champions. They also won the national championship last summer in Missouri.
