White Columns And How It All Began ...

Retrospection is an exercise in history. You young people, teachers and others might wonder how this yearbook began. In years prior to 1962, the school did not sponsor a yearbook. Instead, the VIRGINIA GUIDE would print a senior edition with a few pictures of seniors interspersed with the school news. In 1961 the School for the Blind, where Bill English was principal, printed the first separate yearbook for the blind students. It did not catch on with them because many of their students did not have sufficient vision to see the pictures.

The superintendent then was Mr. Joe Shinpaugh. He suggested to me that a yearbook might be more popular in the school for the deat In following up, I encouraged Jan Repass, DaWayne Werner and Hugh Waddy to serve as faculty advisors. I used members of my literature class to serve as yearbook staff with the late George Oakes taking over as editor. At that time, we did not engage the services of a professional photographer. Instead, Jan Repass went around with his fine and trusty camera taking candid shots of all students and staff. At that time the school had a much larger enrollment. The famous Coach T. Carlton Lewellyn was one year away from his retirement, but still coached football and taught shoe making. Ray Parks taught physical education and coached basketball. Leslie Hinnant taught printing. Irvin Rosen was still the master in the cabinet shop. In addition there were classes in typing, hair dressing, cooking, dressmaking and barbering. They younger boys had elementary industrial arts and the younger girls learned elementary sewing (taught by Mrs. Ruby Sebrell). Ralph Kiser and Tom Sebrell were in charge of the older boys' dormitory. Louise Abernathy (for whom the school's natatorium was named) was a counselor for the older girls. Mrs. Virginia Stratton still had her Friday morning chorus and Nancy Gordon was supervisor of the girls' vocational classes. A number of that fine crew has passed away. A number of former students, including Editor George Oakes, have entered that domain in the sky.

My literature class had quite a time in coming up with a name for the yearbook. It was Leslie Kidd that suggested "White Columns" to honor the stately Main Building.

In this first yearbook, one will find pictures of some familiar faces, including Mr. Richard Koch who went on to Gallaudet and returned to teach history here for quite a while. Freda Norman, the famous actress for the National Theater of the Deaf was a sophomore as was Betty Anna Belle Roop who later taught at the famous American School for the Deaf in Hartford, Connecticut and wrote a fine history of the school which was the first permanent school for the deaf in America. Glenda Snyder was a senior that year. She went on to Gallaudet and taught there for a long time. She married the popular raconteur, Bill Ennis. Brenda Searls (Carper) then a Junior now serves as publicity director for the Virginia Association of the Deaf. Her brother, Matthew (now Dr. Matthew Searls of the National technical Institute for the Deaf) was a third grader at VSD in 1962.




Gallaudet Day Program
