The 2003—2004 White Columns staff is proud to dedicate this yearbook to Linda Blehm. She has a positive attitude and faith in her students' abilities.






She helps students learn and handles problems gracefully. Linda Blehm has worked here for many years. It is good for us to look up to such a good role model!


What area do you feel you have benefited most from by attend-


