Space Camp

Space Camp for Interested Visually Impaired Students (SCIVIS)

This is a six-day program jam-packed with astronaut training for young people. Activities include simulated Space Shuttle missions, IMAX movies, training simulators, rocket building and launches, scientific experiments, and lectures on the past, present, and future of space exploration.

This program is the best live ever seen for helping visually impaired students gain interest in science. Everything is geared to them, and all materials are in Braille and large print. For them to be able to attend the real Space Camp and to have so many professionals interested in teaching them about the space program is truly inspiring to the students.

In the fall of 2004, four students from the VSDB Blind Department attended Space Camp for the Visually Impaired. Adam Puckett went to MACH II, which is a military-style flight school, and Allyssa Cook, Brittany Savage, and Kyle McKinney attended Space Academy.

As you can see from the pictures, there were many highlights to the week. Each student takes on a role of a space mission member, and learns what it's like to be a Mission Commander, Shuttle Pilot, or Ground Crew Commander, to give some examples. They learn about famous pilots and NASA astronauts, and the situations they encounter in space.
























Read to Feed
