Birthday: November 4, 1986



Deaf Awareness Week

Space Camp

Space Camp for Interested Visually Impaired Students (SCIVIS)

This is a six-day program jam-packed with astronaut training for young people. Activities include simulated Space Shuttle missions, IMAX movies, training simulators, rocket building and launches, scientific experiments, and lectures on the past, present, and future of space exploration.

Here at VSDB in Staunton, the students compete for a chance to go to Space Camp. They write an essay on why they want to go as well as an essay on something they have accomplished that demonstrated responsibility. They also complete a research paper on some aspect of the space program. Then a teacher committee chooses the students they feel are most qualified to represent the school.

In the fall of 2005, Tashia Schmelling, Brittany Savage, Adam Puckett, and Sean Dugas attended SCIVIS. Tashia participated in Space Academy, Brittany and Adam took part in Advanced Academy, and Sean was a member of the Aviation Challenge program, a flight training program. They were accompanied by Anne Knopp, the Science teacher, and Cheryl Baker, Orientation and Mobility specialist. All four students performed extremely well and represented VSDB admirably. Sean was awarded Aviation Challenge's highest honor, the Top Gun award. Brittany and Adam's Advanced Academy team won an award for their performance on their final mission. Tashia was chosen to be commander of the space shuttle for her team. The students worked hard as well as had lots of fun and made many new friends!






